Figure of Speech

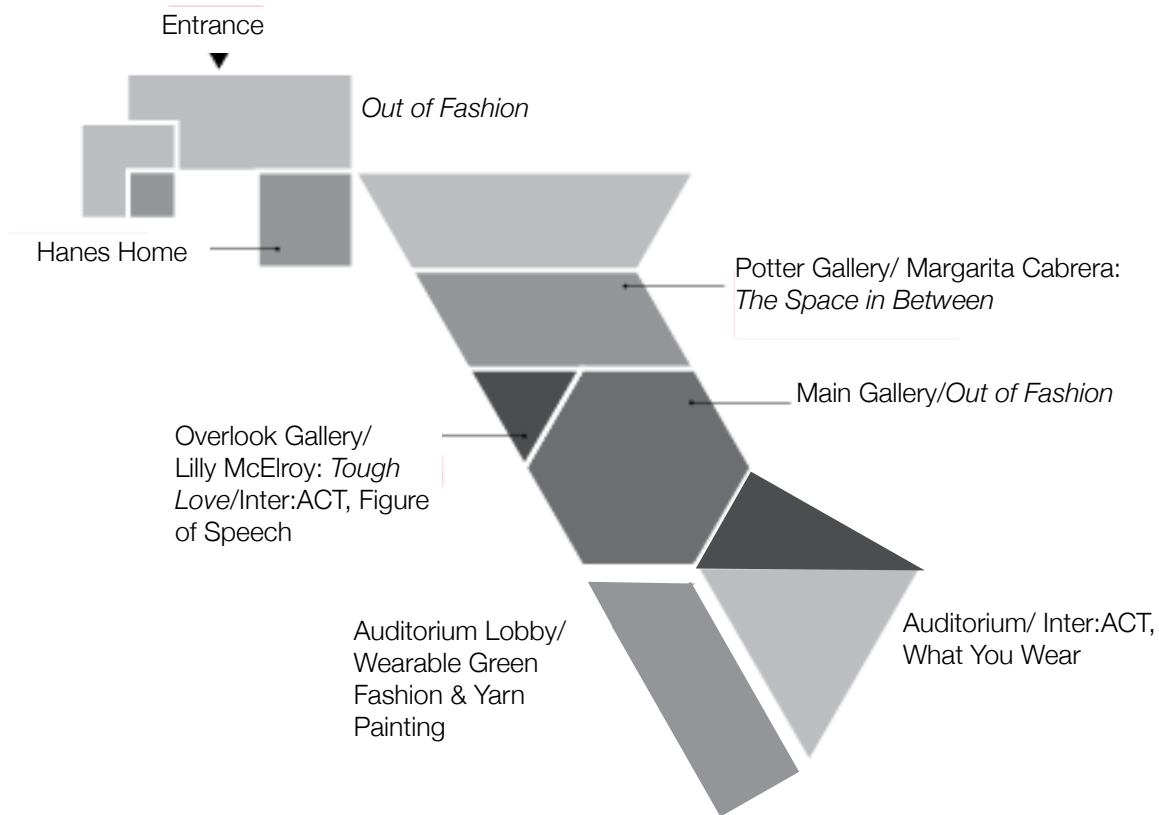
